Working with Schools and partners e.g. Ayrshire College to gain meaningful qualifications.	Use of 1-1 and group engagement to help build confidence and identify the young person's strengths and interests.	Encouraging young people to reach a positive destination, such as work, training or further education.	In-job support for working young people to sustain employment.	Lone parents, parents under 25, parents with a disability, parents with 3+ children, ethnic minority parents, parents of children <1.
Building relationships and removing barriers through creative learning, physical exercise and vocational experience.	Application support - College, Modern Apprenticeships and jobs.
